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Are you a Service Provider who does outpatient appointments? Do you want to help us understand what service providers think about client engagement? Consider participating in our study.

What is this study about:

- This study is our way of knowing what client engagement means to service providers and to clients/caregivers.
- Our goal is to know what you think it means to be involved during outpatient visits.
- You should participate because you can tell us things to make visits to Holland Bloorview the best they can be for you and your clients!

Who can participate?

We are looking for...Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists/Physiotherapists, Child and Youth Workers, Child Life Specialists, Nurses, Therapeutic Recreation Specialists, Speech Language Pathologists, Social Workers, Early Childhood Educators, Life Skills Coaches and Music Therapists who are involved in Standard Outpatient, Early Intervention, Gross Motor and Life Skills programs at Holland Bloorview

What's involved?

NEW This study runs till December 31, 2016 and involves you and your client, or a caregiver for your client, being observed by a Research Assistant at an outpatient appointment at Holland Bloorview. You can choose to be observed up to two times, once per client or caregiver. You would then be interviewed by the Research Assistant after the appointment during scheduled work hours, or outside scheduled work hours. This interview would be approximately 30 minutes long.

What are the benefits of participating?

- Service providers will receive a \$40 giftcard if the interview is done outside scheduled work hours. \$40 will go towards the service providers' program if the interview is done during scheduled work hours.
- Not much is known about what service providers think about client engagement in outpatient visits, so you can help us learn more so that we can share that with other researchers and families!
