Housing in Toronto and the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) can be very expensive. Here are some suggestions for financial supports to help you pay for your housing.

# If You Are Receiving OW or ODSP

The following are resources that can help you with rent payments and utility payments if you are receiving Ontario Works (OW) or Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP).

# **Housing Stabilization Fund (HSF)**

The Housing Stabilization Fund (HSF) is available to those who are receiving either OW or ODSP. The money can be used for the following purposes:

- Last month's rent (when signing a new lease)
- Establishing a residence (example: buying furniture)
- Rental arrears
- Energy arrears (help paying for hydro, gas, fuel)
- Moving costs within Ontario
- Bed and encasement issuances (buying a bed for a new child joining your family, or for a child who has outgrown their current bed)
- Purchasing beds and soft furniture when there is verification of bed bug treatment

Contact your OW or ODSP case worker to ask them about accessing the Housing Stabilization Fund (HSF).

### Home Energy Conservation Supplies - Ontario Works

People receiving Ontario Works (OW) can receive a one-time payment of up to \$50 for the cost of items relating to energy conservation (e.g. insulation for pipes, water conserving shower heads, etc.)

## **Emergency Energy Fund (EEF)**

## **Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP)**

The Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) is available to those who are not receiving OW or ODSP. This program will help you to pay for energy costs if you have overdue bills or a disconnection notice.
