Are you an administrator of an Ontario school?

Participate in a research study involving educational resources developed to help support students with Acquired Brain Injury (ABI)!

What is this study about:

- The NOVEL lab at Holland Bloorview Hospital developed an online professional development module for teachers and educators working with students with ABI. The module covers what is acquired brain injury, the challenges a student can face in school after having an acquired brain injury, and practical strategies teachers can use to support these students.

Who can participate?

- We are inviting schools across Ontario to take part in our study.

What's involved?

- We will provide you with educational resources about ABI to use as professional development for your educators.
- This study requires two 1-hour interviews with a school leader to plan the delivery of the training.
- The training will take approximately 1 hour of educators' time to complete, including questionnaires and reviewing the educational resources.

Potential Benefits?

- Participation will help us learn if and how these educational resources are beneficial to teachers, educators and children post-acquired brain injury.

Potential Risks?

- Participation may cause teachers and educators to feel as if ABI knowledge and use of resources is being evaluated. The research team will be available if help is required when completing the resources!
