<b>My Dad Matthew</b> (Grades 4 to 8)	<p>This uplifting short story, told by 14-year-old Elijah, is about his great admiration for his dad, Matthew. Matthew teaches at university and has cerebral palsy. He communicates by using a pointer and a keyboard. <b>Anything You Can Do</b> (Grades K to 8)	<p>Two boys compete at being silly and doing tricks. <b>Macropolis</b> (Grades 1 to 3)	A story about two toys discarded from a factory production line because they are missing a part. They become friends as they look for a child to adopt them.
