Did you know....

- Population: Canada has the fourth-largest Jewish population in the world. The Jewish community in Canada encompasses those who identify as Jewish culturally, ethnically, and/or religiously. <u>Source</u>
- Ancient Origins: Jewish heritage traces its roots back to the Israelites, a group who
 lived in the region of the Levant and later formed the kingdoms of Israel and Judah.

- Cultural Diversity: Jewish culture is diverse, encompassing various regional traditions, languages, and customs. Sephardic and Ashkenazi Jews represent two major ancestral groups, with Sephardic Jews originating from Spain, Portugal, North Africa, and the Middle East, and Ashkenazi Jews from France and Central and Eastern Europe. Source
- Judaism as a Core Belief: Judaism, with its emphasis on monotheism, ethical behavior, and the study of the Torah, is central to Jewish identity and practice. <u>Source</u>
- Shared History and Memory: Jewish heritage places a strong emphasis on remembering historical events, both joyous and tragic, such as the Exodus from Egypt and the Holocaust, to learn from the past and build a better future. <u>Source</u>
