It's Pride Month. So, what does this mean exactly?

- Pride is a moment to celebrate the diverse and vibrant 2SLGBTQ2+ communities.
- It honours progress towards acceptance and equality, including the right to marry and adopt, and the continued work towards legal recognition of all identities.
- Canada has a long history of Pride celebrations, starting with the First Gay Liberation Protest and March at Parliament Hill in Ottawa in 1971.
- In 1978, Vancouver hosted the unofficial first Pride Parade in Canada.
- The first official municipal Pride Parade was held in Vancouver in 1981.
- The first two official Pride festivals and marches in Canada took place in Vancouver and Montreal.

- On January 7, 2022, Conversion therapy became illegal in Canada with the passage of Bill C-4. Although conversion therapy is still permitted in other countries, this is a significant development for 2SLGBTQIA+ rights in Canada.
